

CHMCC Community Meeting Minutes
May 14, 2015
7:00 p.m.
CHM Center

1. Opening prayer, recap of previous meeting and review of important dates
2. Mark Washington thanked CHM residents for the restraint and respect of self and community they showed during April's unrest.
3. Shana Roth-Gormley updated community residents on pending settlement offer from Scott Wizig.
4. Mark Washington updated the community about the Tivoly Avenue demolition project and upcoming press event with the Mayor and meeting with residents of Fenwick Avenue and Deputy Housing Commissioner Julia Day to discuss concerns and the health impact of the Tivoly Avenue demolition on residents remaining in the area. Fenwick Avenue residents are now starting to be relocated. Ms. Epps of Fenwick Avenue stated the dust from the demolition was unbearable. Neighbor Ralph Stewart agreed. Mr. Washington pointed out demolition crews not complying with regulations and that CHM has asked Baltimore Housing to intervene.
5. CHM will oppose a zoning request for 1849 E. 29th Street to become a beauty shop.
6. CHM will file a petition to regulate hours of operation for Chinese Cuisine carryout.
7. CHM and Healthy Neighborhoods will host a faith based loan meeting on May 16th
8. Mrs. Scott asked about the dumping that has reoccurred on Robb Street. Mrs. Scott informed area reported to code enforcement for remediation and investigation.
9. Mr. Maurice S. commented he saw nothing going on in the community. It was pointed the recent community pitch in on his block, the numerous CHM field visits to the area with his neighbor Mrs. Ridgely and the upcoming inspection of the area by code enforcement supervisor Peter Nyabagosi. Mr. Maurice S. then stated he did not come outside much and closed his doors when he gets home.
10. Mr. Isa Shah stated the problem with the community was residents wanting something done for them instead of us taking care of our community. CHM resident voiced growing concern with activity at 1740 E. 30th Street.
11. Mark Washington updated residents with information on a double homicide that occurred earlier in the day.
12. CHM President Monique Gilliam urged residents with public safety concerns to attend the monthly NE District Community Relations meeting as residents voiced concerns with a lack of policing in the area following April's unrest. Mrs. Hawks commented nothing was going to be done and the Mayor was less than acceptable. CHM board member Anthony Walters announced free summer steel drum class at CHM.
13. Officer Joseph Banks had to exit meeting but left monthly crime data.
